Greetings,

Glen Eden continues in our efforts to protect the health and safety of our members. The threat of infection continues to be a major concern.

Update:

On October 20, 2020, the State of California moved Riverside County from “Red” back to “Purple”. This move was based on new figures which placed Riverside County **at 9.1 for daily new COVID cases per 100,000 and 6.9% for cases that are tested positive**. Based on the figures, Riverside County met the requirements to stay in the Red category for positivity rate but did not meet the criteria for new cases per 100,000. As a result, Riverside County will remain in the purple “Widespread” category for at least the next three weeks.

What does this mean for Glen Eden Operations?:

- The Gym will be closed until we move back to “Red”.
- Programs and activities that have been approved risk/mitigation plans will be allowed to continue.
- Café will remain open for take-out orders only.
- Physical distancing of at least six feet is required in all areas.
- Except for members of the same household, facial covering is highly recommended in all social gathering situations, including rental sites, even when physical distancing of at least six feet is being maintained.
- Facial covering is required when entering and exiting common recreation areas, including pools and spas. When using a chair or a lounge and six feet of social distancing is being maintained, facial covering may be removed but must be readily available to be deployed as needed.
- Facial covering may be removed when in the pools or spas as long as six feet of social distancing is maintained. Facial covering must be readily available to be deployed as needed.
- Facial covering must be readily available to deploy should physical distancing not be possible. For example, when walking.
- Exceptions to facial covering requirements are provided within approved activity mitigation plans.
- Wash hands and/or use hand sanitizer frequently.
